

Circle Contact Lens

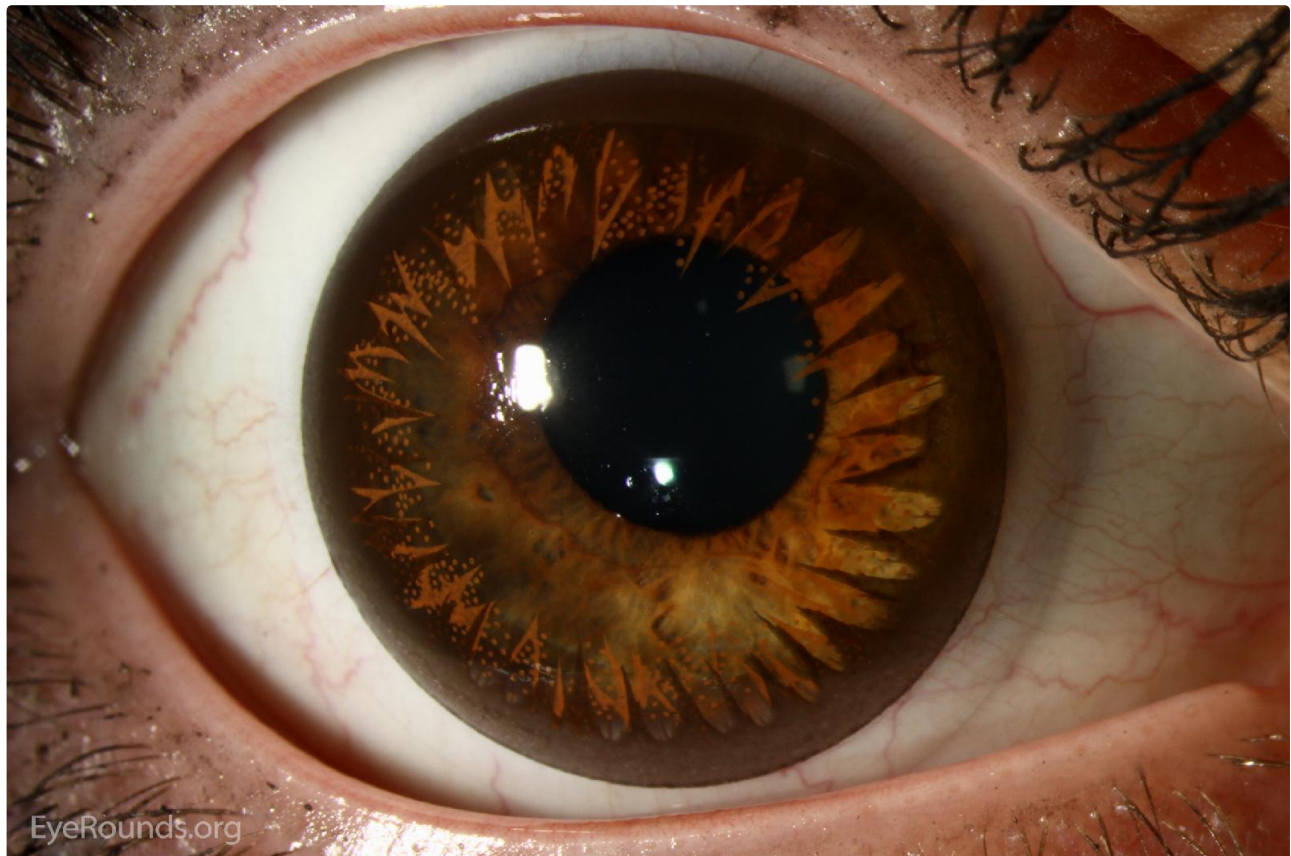
Category(ies): Contact Lens
